What does it mean to serve?

The underlying Greek word:

Predominately the verb form of the noun for DEACON

A deacon is a servant!

QUESTION: What does a servant do?

The English dictionary:

serve | sərv | verb, perform duties or services for (another person or an organization)

For the Christian, we are to serve God, and we are to serve others.



How can I serve God AND OTHERS?

- 4. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit.
- 5. And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord.
- 6. There are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all persons.
- 7. But to each one is given the manifestation *(outward evidence)* of the Spirit for the common good.

Respect the Gifts of Others

"For just as we have many members in one body and all the members do not have the same function," - Rom. 12:4c

We're called to serve using our spiritual gifts.



Christ's Church: diversity in unity, unity in diversity

- 5. So we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another.
- 6. Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, each of us is to exercise them accordingly: if prophecy, according to the proportion of his faith;
- 7. If service, in his serving; or he who teaches, in his teaching;
- 8. Or he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.

Romans 12:5-8 (NASB95)



- 1 "Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship.
